"Do means-tested benefits reduce the demand for annuitites? Evidence from Switzerland"

Most industrializes countries provide a subsistence level consumption floor in old age, usually in the form of means-tested benefits or income supplements. The availability of such means-tested payments may create an incentive to optimally cash out (occupational) pension wealth for low and middle income earners. We analyze optimal annuity demand and consumption/savings decisions in a realistic life-cycle model under a social security scheme in which means tested benefits can be claimed if income falls below a certain subsistence level. The model is calibrated to the Swiss case and the resulting predictions compared to the observed annuitization rates in Swiss pension funds. We show that the predicted annuitization rates are roughly consistent with the cash out patterns observed in Switzerland.

We conduct experiments to investigate the effects of decision rules on bargaining outcomes in small and large groups. In particular, we investigate the effects of different majority requirements on delay (number of bargaining rounds needed to reach agreement) and measures of "fairness" (inclusiveness of coalitions, equality of the distribution).
