"Global Public Goods and International Organizations: World Bank COVID-19 Lending as a Case Study"

One important function of international organizations is to provide global public goods. However, a substantial literature finds that the effectiveness of international organizations is undermined by geopolitics, i.e., outcomes where the institution caters to the narrow interests of dominant member countries, effectively providing private goods rather than public goods. This paper examines lending decisions by the World Bank in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, exploring whether these decisions are shielded from U.S. influence. Analysis of the data through the end of 2020 finds no evidence of bias in COVID lending decisions despite continued bias for other lending decisions (Kilby and McWhirter, forthcoming). This paper extends this analysis through October 26, 2021, to see whether COVID lending remains insulated from geopolitics or whether the extended nature of the pandemic has allowed a resumption of business as usual.

"Converting Probabilistic Survey Responses into Continuous Probability Distributions"

The standard approach to convert probabilistic survey responses into continuous probability distribution requires that the question intervals are equally wide. Almost all recently established household surveys have intervals of varying widths. Applying the standard approach to surveys with varying widths gives unreasonable and misleading results. This note shows how the standard approach needs to be adjusted to account for intervals of unequal width.
