"When to get that extra paycheck? - Evaluation of a de-nudge policy"

Choice architecture has been a prominent theme in the recent literature. Special interest has been paid to nudging, i.e. when the choice architect has preferences over the available choices. We study a situation where an existing nudge is revoked. We exploit a natural experiment in the Netherlands where civil servants through a new policy can decide when and how to get their 13th and 14th salary parts within a year. For different governmental layers, the policy is introduced at different points in time with different defaults on the same initial choice set. We make use of administrative panel data on more than 21 million monthly paychecks. We first show that default stickiness depends on the default and how long the default is in effect. Default stickiness differs up to 15% depending on the default. Second, we show that for new civil servants with no experience with the old system the default stickiness differs an additional 13%. Third, the policy has no effects on household savings and labor supply.
