## **Abstracts**

"Digital Discrimination: Political Exclusion Deprives Ethnic Groups of Internet Access"

The global expansion of the Internet is frequently associated with improved government transparency, political rights and democracy. However, this as- sumption depends on marginalized groups getting access in the first place. In this paper, we document a strong and persistent political bias in the allocation of Internet coverage across ethnic groups worldwide. Relying on new measurements of Internet penetration through network measurements, we show that politically excluded ethnic groups suffer from significantly lower Internet penetration rates as compared to those in power, an effect that cannot be explained by economic or geographic factors. Our findings underline one of the central impediments to "liberation technology", which is that governments still play a key role in the allocation and control of the Internet, and can, intentionally or not, sabotage its liberating effects.
