### Departmental Seminar

Daniel John Zizzo

"Objectives and Confounds in Economic Experiments"

The key general problem in design, evaluating and defending an experimental design is to determine whether there are factors affecting experimental behavior that are not being duly taken into account by the researcher. This methodological presentation will consider, in general terms and with examples, when a critique of an experiment as being affected by a serious confound has a prima facie appeal, and what are the defences and strategies that can be adopted when this criticism is received. I take a functional perspective of confounds: what matters is the relationship between experimental objectives and potential confounds.

### Departmental Workshop

"Juvenile Law and Recidivism in Germany - New Evidence from the Old Continent" \*

Using a unique sample of German inmates, we analyze the dependence of recidivism on juvenile and criminal law. First, we jointly model the selection and the recidivism equation in a bivariate probit model. In a second step we use the discontinuities in assignment created by German legislation and apply a (fuzzy) regression discontinuity design. In contrast to the bulk of the literature, which mainly relies on US data, we do not find that the application of criminal law increases juvenile recidivism. Rather, our results suggest that sentencing adolescents as adults reduces recidivism in Germany.
